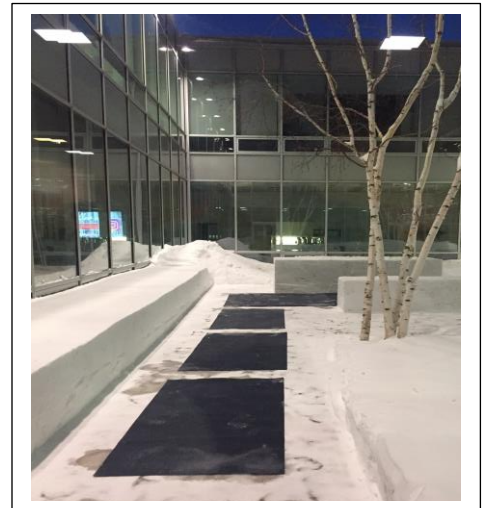
# ATMOSHERE 11

Atmosphere 11 – the annual winter symposium in the Faculty of Architecture was staged from February 7 to 9, under the theme Adaptation. It was directed by Marcella Eaton and Alyssa Schwann and received generous financial and human support from MALA.

Keynote speakers were Marc Treib, Professor Emeritus of Architecture (and writer on architecture and landscape architecture) from UC Berkeley; Ian Mauro, geographer from the University of Winnipeg; geologist Norman Halden, Dean of Riddell Faculty of Environment, Earth and Resources, University of Manitoba; Marcia Friesen, Associate Dean of Engineering, University of Manitoba; Miriam Kelly, architect at Beyer Blinder Belle, New York; Graeme Brooker, head of interior design at Royal College of Art, London; Bas Smets from Bureau Bas Smets, Bruxelles; and Georges Descombes, architect / landscape architect, Geneva.

Treib opened the event with some thoughts on Adaptation in the environmental design fields; Mauro addressed climate change – at the need for society to adapt accordingly; Halden also addressed climate change ... and the impact of mineral extraction for energy production and for building projects; Friesen addressed Indigenous knowledge in engineering curriculum; Kelly presented her work on three building restoration projects – including the extraordinary aquatic extravaganza of Longwood Gardens, Philadelphia (with West 8); Brooker presented findings from his recent, appropriately-named book, Adaptations – including the contentious argument that building re-use will soon eclipse new buildings; Smets talked about his (relatively young) firm's work – excellent ... try to watch the video (all sessions were recorded); and Descombes talked about his long-running work on denaturalising the Aire river in Switzerland – good work takes time.

Other presenters included MALA members Anna Thurmayr, Dietmar Straub and Liz Wreford; architect Sasa Radulovic; interior designers Cindy Rodych and Shauna Mallory Hill. MALA volunteers Ryan Wakshinski, Vanessa Jukes and Shauna Prociuk kindly introduced speakers and moderated question sessions. And the ice bar (see image) was constructed by volunteer landscape students ...
