

Covid-19 Survey Summary – National Respondents – April vs. June Results

Compared to the April survey, in June:

- 44% decrease in responding to the survey, but similar demographics compared to April survey (regarding residence, registration status, and work type)
- 8% fewer respondents are working in a different location (from home, alternate office, etc.)
- 2% more people have been temporarily laid off
- 10% average increase in work volume – respondents now report slightly higher average work volume than pre-Covid-19 times
- Priorities remain the same: respondents want more online professional educational events, support and resources from their Associations with employment and mental health/wellbeing, and opportunities for networking and sharing best practices
- New comments/requests:
 - Respondents want advocacy for equity, justice, and reconciliation within the profession and support for Black and Indigenous members and associates
 - Respondents want to know how others are making decisions about work location and safety, best practices during Covid-19, and how Covid-19 is impacting others' work and wellbeing
